

STEPHEN HUI GEOLOGICAL MUSEUM

The Stephen Hui Geological Museum is the first and only geological museum in Hong Kong. The mission of the Museum is to provide an attractive object-based learning facility for understanding the nature and evolution of our planet to visitors of all ages. It showcases a world-class collection of about 350 fossils from China, 950 mineral and 300 rock specimens.

The Museum organizes outreach events and activities including the first Mineral Festival in Hong Kong, guided tours for schools, community and overseas groups as well as individual members of the public of all ages. Loan sets including rocks and fossils are available for educational support and can be arranged to suit specific requirements.

Admission is free.

The Stephen Hui Geological Museum, also on the main campus, is the only museum in Hong Kong with a permanent exhibition of minerals. Visitors may view this exhibition individually at any time during the fair, or they may join a short museum tour.
